Detail Pipe Crew Recognized for Safety Efforts

Ten Pipe Welders in the Detail Pipe Shop were recently recognized by their leadership for continuous focus on safety. The third-shift crew is responsible for welding piping details of various materials, shapes, and configurations that are used on every Submarine and Carrier hull built for the Navy. Anything from a ¼ inch pipe socket to a 12 inch X-ray butt.

“This crew always puts safety first, it’s our number one priority” said the crew’s Foreman **Roger Trent**.

Pipe Welder **Calvin Spain** says that safety begins the moment he wakes up each day. “I place safety in the front of my mind on a daily

basis – both at home and at work,” he said. “For our crew, staying safe is a team effort. We are family and it starts with our foreman. Roger brings our focus to safety at the beginning of every shift and drives our focus on safety throughout the shift.”

Pipe Welder and Make-up Foreman **Chris Busch** added, “Our crew knows each other on a personal level, so therefore we take safety very personal. We communicate with one another on a regular basis and if we see something that might look dangerous or unsafe, we will warn whoever is involved and try to help. If we feel we can’t accomplish to task safely, then we will stop the job until we can.”

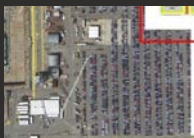

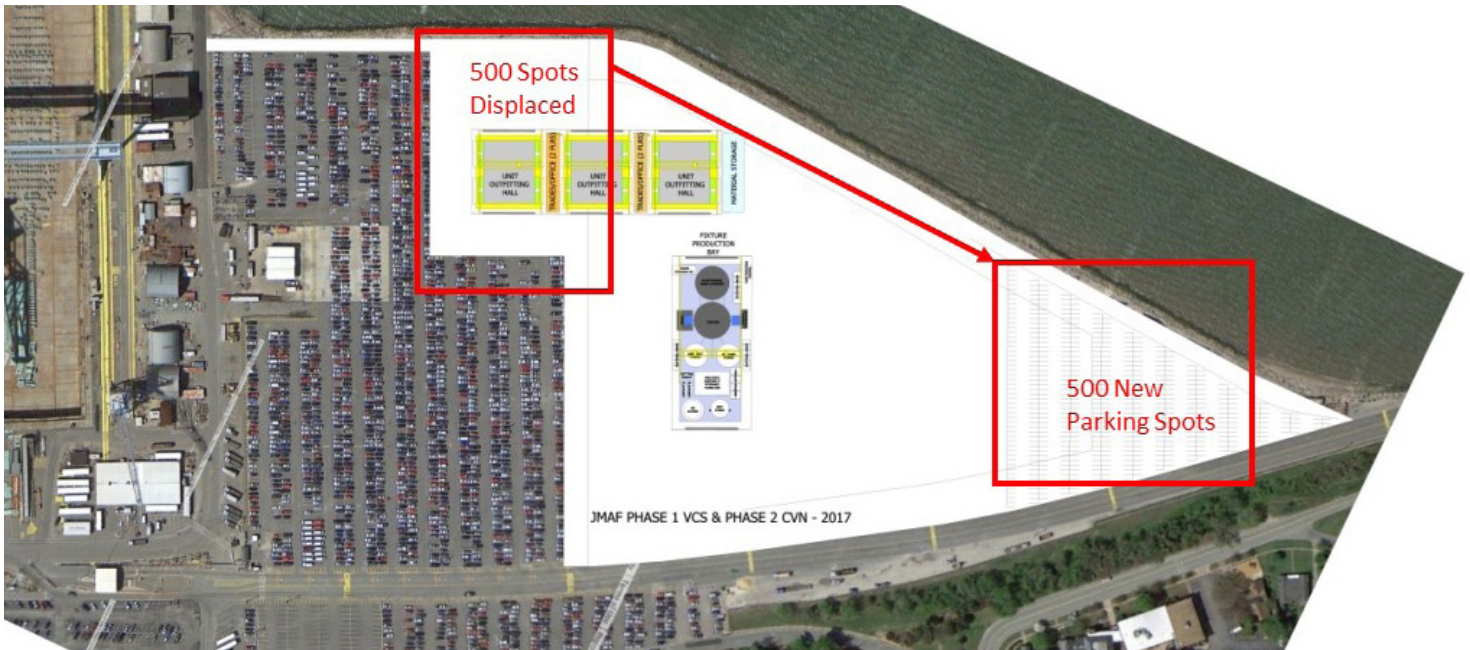

North Yard Parking Changes

Construction of the new state-of-the-art Joint Manufacturing Assembly Facility (JMAF) at the northern end of the shipyard is now underway.

As a result, 500 parking spaces will be relocated

to a new location in the North Yard beginning Feb. 15. Signs directing employees to the new parking spaces will be in place. This change will not result in the loss of parking spaces.

In addition, the NNS Park-and-Ride shuttle service will resume service from the bus stop

near the North Yard Gate to and from the Hidens parking lot located at 63rd and Warwick Blvd. The shuttle will operate from 5-8 a.m. and 2-6 p.m. A single van will run the shuttle route from 8 a.m. - 12 p.m. and 12:30 - 3:00 p.m.

The American Red Cross' bloodmobile visits Newport News Shipbuilding 48 times per year in various locations.

Below are other "did you know" facts about the American Red Cross:

- The American Red Cross blood program started in 1940, under the leadership of Dr. Charles Drew.
- The American Red Cross supplies about 40 percent of the nation's blood supply.
- The Red Cross provides blood for patients

in approximately 2,700 hospitals across the U.S.

- The Red Cross makes blood available to any patient who needs it — patients are not required to find donors to replace the blood they use (a practice common in Europe and some U.S. blood banks) allowing the patient and their family to focus on recovery.
- Eighty percent of the blood donations given to the Red Cross are collected at mobile blood drives set up at community organizations, companies, high schools, colleges, places of worship or military

installations. The remaining 20 percent are collected at fixed Red Cross donor centers.

- The American Red Cross works with more than 50,000 blood drive sponsors each year to hold more than 200,000 blood drives, providing convenient locations for people to give blood.

HII Family Health Center Nearing Completion

Construction crews are putting the final touches on the exterior and interior of the new HII Family Health Center. QuadMed, the health provider that will operate the center, will receive keys to the facility and begin moving in shortly.

When complete, the two-story, 21,894 square-foot facility will have 19 exam rooms, five specialty rooms and two pediatric rooms. It will also have an X-ray and chemistry lab, and a fully operational pharmacy with drive-through service.

The Family Health Center is available to active non-represented HII employees and dependents enrolled in an eligible Anthem PPO or CDHP plan and represented Fire Fighters enrolled in their Anthem medical insurance. Services will cost \$15 per patient, per visit and preventive services provided at no cost.

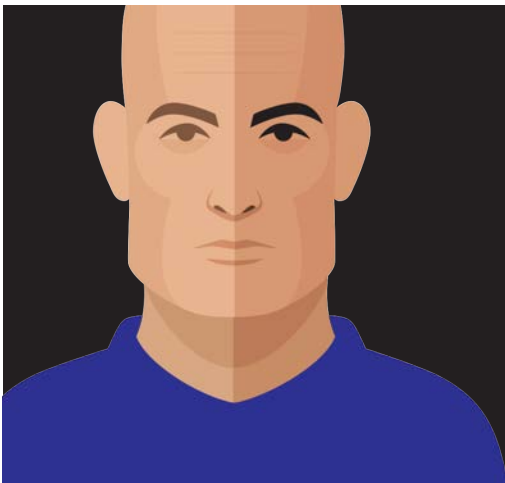
