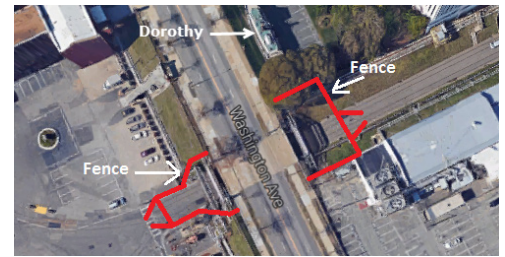
In-Service Aircraft Carrier Program Promotes the ISC/NV Engagement Comment Line

NOTICE: Washington Avenue Bridge Replacement Will Affect Traffic

The City of Newport News is scheduled to begin the Washington Avenue Bridge replacement July 11. Vehicle and pedestrian traffic on Washington Avenue between 42nd and 37th street will be affected through September 2017.

The four traffic lanes on the bridge will be reduced to one north-bound and one south-bound lane and the walkway on Washington Avenue will be reduced to one side of the street during the construction period. Employees should expect potential gridlock during heavy traffic times while construction is underway.

Additionally, vehicles and pedestrians will not be able to cross under the Washington Avenue Bridge through the railroad cut. Vehicles and pedestrians accessing the east yard will be routed through the 40th Street Gate.

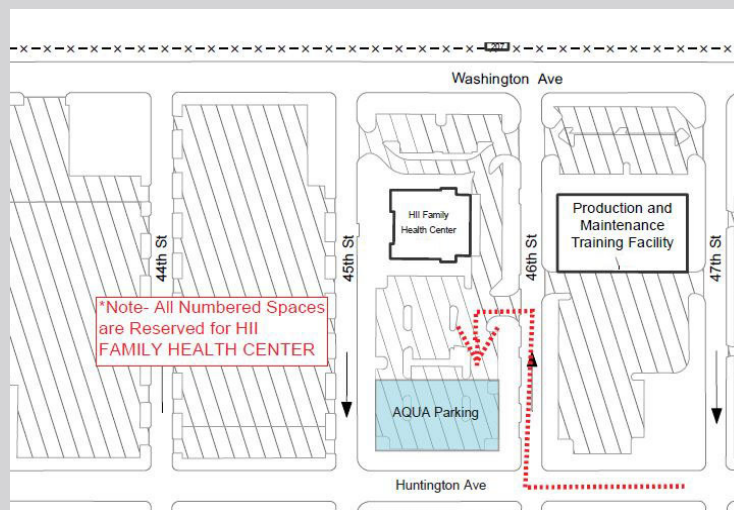
