Did You Know?

Salaried-exempt employees are required to record time worked during their standard 8-hour shift unless eligible for premium pay or pre-approved to use flex time.



For example:

The employee's standard shift is from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., but they worked from 6:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.

The employee should charge their time to the appropriate direct (project/contract) or indirect (overhead) charges that they worked between 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. (excluding lunch) and the employee should not record any time prior to 7:30 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. unless eligible for premium pay or pre-approved to use flex time.

Time and attendance reporting requirements are outlined in NN Policy 10-403.

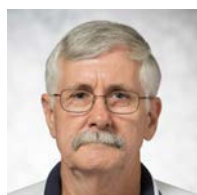

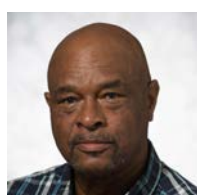

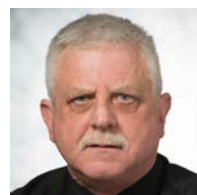
