I WAS BORN IN SELMA, AL RIGHT AT THE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT. WE DIDN'T LIVE THERE VERY LONG, MY DAD WAS IN THE AIR FORCE. WE MOVED TO TEXAS, CALIFORNIA, NEW JERSEY, WASHINGTON STATE, JAPAN. SO I'VE HAD QUITE A LOT OF EXPERIENCES. WHEN I GOT BACK TO VIRGINIA I ENTERED THOMAS EATON MIDDLE SCHOOL. THERE WAS A VERY BIG RACE DIVISION IN THAT SCHOOL AT THAT TIME. I JUST HAD A HARD TIME UNDERSTANDING WHY WERE PEOPLE HATING EACH OTHER AND FIGHTING WITH EACH OTHER BECAUSE OF THEIR SKIN COLOR. TO ME I HAD NOT EXPERIENCED THAT, WE DID NOT HAVE THAT DIVISION ON BASE. IF WE HAD ANY KIND OF DIFFERENCES IT WAS, "MY DAD'S A COLONEL, AND YOUR DAD'S A MAJOR." IT WAS NOT YOUR SKIN COLOR.

BEYOND THE RACE ISSUE THAT I EXPERIENCED IN MIDDLE SCHOOL I SOON LEARNED THAT THERE WERE OTHER STEREOTYPES. I ACTUALLY WAS A VICTIM OF A STEREOTYPE BECAUSE I HAVE BLONDE HAIR. I'M A BLONDE FEMALE. WELL EVERYONE KNOWS BLONDES HAVE MORE FUN. SO, I HAVE NO PROBLEM WITH BEING BLONDE. I HAVE A LOT OF FUN WITH THE "BLONDE-ISMS" AND THE BLONDE JOKES. I LAUGH AT THEM JUST AS HARD AS ANYBODY ELSE. BUT I DON'T LIKE WHEN SOMEBODY DISCREDITS ME, OR UNDERESTIMATES MY INTELLIGENCE. THE MEN SOMETIMES MAKE THE FEMALES FEEL LIKE WE'RE INADEQUATE. SOME WOMEN MAYBE DON'T HAVE THE CONFIDENCE TO CHALLENGE THOSE STEREOTYPES. YOU MAY HAVE JUST DISCOURAGED SOMEBODY WHO COULD HAVE BEEN A VERY POWERFUL FORCE.

I TELL YA, I'M ONE OF THE BEST PLANNERS IN THE SHIPYARD, AND I'M VERY PROUD TO SAY THAT. I GRADUATED WITH HONORS FROM THOMAS NELSON. I WENT TO CHRISTOPHER NEWPORT. THEN I CAME HERE TO THE APPRENTICE SCHOOL AND I STARED AS AN X31 ON THE WATERFRONT, WHERE I EXCELLED BOTH ACADEMICALLY AND IN THE SHOP.
