Holiday Food Drive Provides More Than 80,000 Meals

Through donations of food and money, shipbuilders provided more than 80,000 meals for families across the region during Newport News Shipbuilding's annual Holiday Food Drive in December. That is a 25 percent increase from the number of meals shipbuilders provided during the 2016 drive.

Shipbuilders gave more than 20,000 pounds of food and more than \$15,000 toward the effort, which supports the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank.

"So many of our neighbors are struggling to meet basic needs and facing hunger on a daily basis," said Community Relations Representative **Judy Fundak**. "Children and the elderly are especially vulnerable. But with the support of our amazing shipbuilders, the 2017 Food Drive enabled the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank to provide 80,735.5 meals to those in need, once again substantiating the fact our shipbuilders are the best in the world."

For the past three years, Propulsion Steam Plant and Valve Engineering (E71) has supported the food drive in a unique way. The department's eight supervisors, plus their manager, each form teams and compete to see which group can donate the most. The winning team, Avery's Pantry Stuffers, donated more than 247 pounds per person.

Altogether, E71 shipbuilders donated about 3,482 pounds of food and more than \$4,267. "The food drive competition is very engaging for the department and we love the competition, but we all know it's about giving back to the community and doing our part in the battle against hunger – everybody wins," said E71 Department Manager **Bill Connolly**.

NNS Awarded Contract for *Columbia*-Class Submarine Work

Newport News Shipbuilding has been awarded a contract from General Dynamics Electric Boat (EB) worth up to \$468 million for integrated product and process development work for the U.S. Navy's new *Columbia*-class submarines.

Contract work began in October and allows for the completion of the design. It also includes engineering analysis, component and technology development, detail planning and technical services.

Laser Scanning at Sea

As laser scanning technology becomes more popular at Newport News Shipbuilding, designers and engineers have successfully tested laser scanning at sea to speed up ship checks and contracts, ultimately growing the business base.

Laser scanning equipment includes a FARO scanner, which is essentially a blue box on a tripod that spins 360 degrees capturing images and dimensional point cloud data. The images are then downloaded to SD cards. NNS is also using hand scanners that can capture dimensional point cloud data without having to set a scanner on a tripod.

"Laser scanning is basically a picture with dimensional data," Designer **Woody Woods** (E63) said. "It's like you're walking on the ship on your computer screen."

NNS Awarded Contract for *Columbia*-Class Submarine Work

EB was awarded the prime contract in September, and NNS is the subcontractor for the new class of ballistic-missile submarines that are being designed to replace *Ohio*-class submarines.

"This contract leverages the productive partnership we've built with EB in the construction of *Virginia*-class submarines," said **Dave Bolcar**, vice president of submarine programs at NNS. "We are excited and ready to do our part to support EB and deliver these submarines to the Navy in an efficient and cost-effective manner."

Construction of the 12-submarine *Columbia* class is expected to begin in fiscal year 2021, with the first delivery to the Navy in 2028.

Columbia-class construction will utilize NNS' outstanding shipbuilders, existing infrastructure and current submarine and carrier centers of excellence to design and build modules similar to that of *Virginia*class submarines. The program will also integrate new facilities such as the Joint Manufacturing and Assembly Facility (JMAF).

Woods and Electrical Engineer **Nathan Vandygriff** (E63) recently spent time aboard the tugboat *Huntington* to test laser scanning technology. They joined Captain **Allen Sutton** (X36), who piloted the tug along the James River, purposefully making sharp turns and changing speeds. The maneuvers helped increase vibrations for testing laser scans in the engine room.

"Usually when we scan, we're tied to a pier and the engines aren't running," Woods said. "Out here we're trying to get as much movement and vibration to see if the scans are impacted."

Woods gave the SD cards to Vandygriff who processed the scans on a laptop using a program called Auto-desk ReCap. Once back in the office, they can transfer the scan data from the laptop to the network so anyone using Auto-desk ReCap can view the scans.

The team hopes to apply the laser scanning technology to ships at sea, such as USS *John C. Stennis* (CVN 74). They aspire to create visual work instructions using laser scanning technology aboard the nuclear-powered supercarrier. NNS is looking for ways to incorporate laser scanning technology in future projects.

"Using laser scanning technology to me means we are a company fostering new ideas to build ships," Woods said. "We just can't continue to build ships the way it was done in the past. We need to learn to harness new technologies and apply them to the shipbuilding business. When I look back at my 31 years in the shipyard, I never thought I would be using this technology. I think it's cool that I'm getting the opportunity to learn the new technologies and apply them to the shipbuilding industry."
